

## GM UPDATE E-BIKES ON TRAILS

## Purpose

- Inform the board about:
  - The need to address issue of e-bikes usage on the trail system by means of a yet undetermined Covenants Rule change
  - Management's outreach plan to engage members in the rule change development process
- Obtain board feedback on the member outreach plan and rule change process

# GENERAL COMMON AREA, OTHER ASSOCIATION-OWNED PROPERTY AND AMENITY RULES

**2.2 Off-Road Vehicles.** Snowmobiles, motor-powered bikes, all-terrain vehicles (ATV's), off-road motorcycles and off-road use of any motorized vehicle is prohibited on Common Areas, and other Association-owned properties, except that the Association may use such vehicles in the furtherance of its operations.

• The phrase "motor-powered bikes" has been read to include e-bikes



# Member Outreach Campaign

- With the goal of developing a widely accepted, sensible and sustainable rule change built on an informed foundation, management intends to develop a rule change recommendation through a transparent process that includes regular member outreach.
- Goal: Engage and educate the member of full range of possibilities. Provide for open discussion of views as we consider how, and under what conditions, e-bikes may or may not be allowed on the trail system.
  - Stage 1: Education and Community Forums
    - Educate members about the e-bike issue through TDA communications toolbox
    - Community Forums: Provide members with a platform to their e-bike hopes, questions, and concerns
      - May be organized by topically. For example: Pro e-bikes, Anti e-bikes, Equestrian, Hiker/Runner, Mountain Biker
  - Stage 2: Using information gathered from community forums, conduct a survey of the wider membership




#### Member Outreach Outcome

- An outreach campaign summary with recommendations will be provided to the board
  - The board will then give direction about a possible rule change
  - If a rule change is proposed, 45-day notice will be required before adoption
    - This could be prolonged due to timing of TD News publication
  - If no rule change is proposed, management will implement a communication plan for the existing rule
