





Report on 2020 Forestry accomplishments

### 2020 HIGHLIGHTS BY THE #S

Visits to private properties for tree advice and permits	610 1 56% over 2019
Visits for change of ownership TFPD Ordinance Defensible Space	603
Visits to properties for TDA defensible space program	975 1 24% over 2019
2021 Defensible Space Program Initial inspections	1,049 properties
Visits to properties of defensible space in order to maintain homeowner's insurance	49 <b>4</b> 33% from 2019
2020 Forest Health Issue Maintenance (dead or damaged trees)	128 100 now complaint/78% compliance rate
Number of property owner vegetation piles chipped	3,078 1,431 tons of material removed
Number of hand piles/burned	838 piles out of 955 (127 remaining)


#### HOMEOWNER DEFENSIBLE SPACE INSPECTION PROGRAM SCHEDULE



201	16	Common Area Plantation/FB	73.9 143.5*	Contract labor costs doubled as bidding changed from a per/hour rate to a per/acre rate. *104.8 acres assisted by a grant. Removed 577 dead trees.
201	17	Common Area Plantation/FB	90.8 84.7*	Board of Directors approved \$150,000 in additional funds, \$62,710 to storm damage and common area work. *26 acres assisted by two grants. Removed 593 dead trees.
201	18	Common Area Plantation/FB	84.1 143.8*	Board of Directors approved \$153,929 in additional funds for storm damage removal and common area work. *103 acres assisted by two grants. Removed 1,116 dead trees.
201	19	Common Area Plantation/FB	83.5 103.5	Board of Directors approved \$153,276 in additional funds for storm damage removal and common area work. Removed 2,718 dead trees.
202	20	Common Area Plantation/FB	79.5* 98.5	Board of Directors approved \$155,000 in additional funding to be included with \$45,000 of Forestry operational budget to complete the Golf Course Project. *The Golf Course Project included 45 acres of common area for 2020. Removed 873 dead trees.







Project Highlight Golf Course Fuel Break


- New 45-acre fuel break: removing large trees and modifying ground fuels
- This project was not a typical logging or fuels reduction project, it presented unique challenges that required special equipment and methods to protect the golf course and sensitive environmental concerns and cultural sites
- Work was completed under a 1038.3 forest fire prevention authorization through State/CalFire





