

PURPOSE – NO ACTION

Provide the Board of Directors with a review of the Alder Creek Adventure Center operating plan

- Early this spring, staff identified the Adventure Center as an under-utilized amenity in the summer months and began strategizing on how to activate the space
- Over the past month, several departments have collaborated to develop a summer schedule to drive member visitation to the location
- Deliberate and focused effort to integrate different trail users through education around trail etiquette, the Trails Master Plan and environmental stewardship

CHANGES

RETURN OF A HOST POSITION

- Beginning June 16 through Labor Day (Sept. 4), the front desk of the Adventure Center will be staffed from 9AM-7:30PM daily to:
 - Welcome and direct folks coming to participate in Bikeworks or Equestrian Center programming
 - Provide information regarding the trail system to educate the different user groups
 - Oversee the retail shop
 - Sell grab-and-go food items/beverages from the Trailside Bar in the absence of F+B staff

ALDER CREEK CAFE OPEN FOR DINNER

- Thursday through Sunday evenings starting June 22, the Alder Creek Cafe will be open for dinner service
- Monday through Wednesday, the ACAC host will be able to pour beer from the Trailside Bar until 7:30PM

TRAIL ETIQUETTE + ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP FOCUS

 Trail etiquette and environmental stewardship information/education will be included in all programming with several events specifically focused on these topics

NEW ACTIVITIES


FRIDAY NIGHT CORNHOLE TOURNAMENTS - Hosted every Friday from July 7 through Aug. 25

TRAIL STEWARDSHIP VOLUNTEER DAYS – Seven events throughout the summer months to begin and end at ACAC

EUER VALLEY TOURS – Two walking tours events in Euer Valley starting and ending at the Adventure Center with a bus ride down and back for those who are unable to get to the valley by hiking or riding

CHECKPOINT EVENTS – Two hiker/biker/equestrian events where participants complete all or some of a course that involves several checkpoints where they will collect a prize

NEW ACTIVITIES CONTINUED

WOMEN'S BIKE CLINICS - Skills clinic designed specifically for women and taught by women on June 24 + 25 and July 1 + 2

EQUESTRIAN BBQ – A smaller version of the Wild West Fest on July 8

COWGIRLS AND COCKTAILS – Return of this event from several years ago; trail ride followed by socializing on the deck with drinks and appetizers on Aug. 5

BIKE DEMO DAYS – Try out an Ibis mountain bike at the Adventure Center on Aug. 10 + 11; more demo days will likely be scheduled in the next month

FAMILY RIDE AND PICNIC IN EUER VALLEY – Ride to Euer Valley and enjoy a picnic lunch each Sunday from July 2 through Aug. 13

HORSE CAMP AND CLINIC – A weekend-long equestrian clinic event Sept. 16 + 17 utilizing the campground for participants to overnight after it is closed for the season
