

# TAHOE DONNER GIVING FUND BOARD UPDATE: 2024 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS JUNE 28, 2024

## OVERVIEW

The Tahoe Donner Giving Fund Committee is pleased to report the 2024 Tahoe Donner Giving Fund Scholarship awards to the Tahoe Donner Board.

### BACKGROUND

On February 23, 2024, the Tahoe Donner Association Board of Directors authorized the award of \$70,000 for 2024 Traditional Scholarships and \$240,000 for IMPACT Scholarships, for a total of \$310,000 in scholarships this spring.

Normally, this report would have been made a month or two earlier. However, a significant delay in releasing this year's FAFSA (the federal aid application form required by most organizations) delayed the timing of college applications and scholarships - not just for us, but for millions of students across the country.

Working with the Tahoe Truckee Community Foundation (TTCF) common application and selection process, the Giving Fund Committee's Scholarship Subcommittee awarded scholarships in two categories: IMPACT and Traditional Scholarships.

### **IMPACT SCHOLARSHIPS**

IMPACT Scholarships are funded by a single anonymous Tahoe Donner member, who in 2019 began funding at \$200,00 per year. This year, recognizing the increasing cost of educational and living expenses, this generous member increased annual funding to \$240,000, awarding \$12,000 per year for up to five years to four students.

This year's IMPACT Scholarships were awarded to:

### **TRADITIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

Traditional Scholarships are funded through the collective donations by hundreds of individual Tahoe Donner members, who generously give during annual summer and winter fundraising campaigns, recurring donations, and other programs.

This year, \$70,000 was approved by the board for these scholarships. \$40,000 was awarded to the students named below in eight one-time awards of \$5,000 each; \$30,000 is being awarded as second-year funding for prior-year scholarship recipients whose first-year transcripts are currently being evaluated.

This year's first-year Traditional Scholarships were awarded to:

This year's second-year funding awards will be announced at a future date.
