RIGHT HERE, RIGHT NOW, ESSENTIAL PROGRAMS AND SERVICES ARE AT RISK

Did you know that **Sierra Senior Services**, the Meals on Wheels provider for Truckee and North Lake Tahoe, faces a likely reduction in funding that would be devastating to the seniors they serve?

In a recent statement, Meals on Wheels America President and CEO Ellie Hollander expressed deep concerns about the House budget reconciliation bill passed this February, which puts at risk "critical funding for Meals on Wheels and other vital programs that help support older adults, such as the Social Services Block Grant program, SNAP and Medicaid."

Tahoe Donner Giving Fund has supported Sierra Senior Services through grant awards for seven of the past ten years.

Did you know that **Friends of the Truckee Library** is working to build a larger, modern library, when national support for libraries, traditionally viewed as an essential community resource, is wavering?

April Cole, executive director of Friends of the Truckee Library, wrote recently in Moonshine Ink, "Our current library was built 50 years ago to serve a population of 2,000. Today, more than 15,000 people hold library cards in Truckee." Originally built with a capacity for only 54 people, it now serves a community of 20,000 residents. The campaign to build a library that meets the needs of Truckee, today and tomorrow, needs support from the community it will serve.

Tahoe Donner Giving Fund has supported Friends of the Truckee Library through grant awards for the past two years. Did you know that the **Boys & Girls Club** is the primary after-school program in our community? There is a greater need for services than there is the capacity to provide them, and there is a greater need for staffing, and those unmet needs are expected to continue growing.

Hedy Chang, who founded Attendance Works, a national nonprofit that seeks to combat chronic absenteeism in schools, spoke recently on National Public Radio about the importance of after-school programs — many of which may be on the chopping block of federal funding cuts. "After-school programs can connect kids to needed resources like food, nutrition," she said. "And make sure that they're connected to something that engages them, makes them excited about learning." For the children who attend them and the parents who rely on them, after-school programs are a vital part of daily life.

GIVING FUND SUCCESS STORY: MEET STEPHANIE, 2025 IMPACT SCHOLAR



"As a first-generation Latina, navigating the realm of financial assistance for higher education was extremely difficult," Stephanie said. "While I had some avenues to seek more information, such as La Fuerza Latina college access program based locally, my family and I never truly understood the importance of seeking financial support for educational pursuits.

"The Impact Scholarship specifically addressed the financial gap I encountered when I began receiving college acceptance letters a few years ago: A gap that neither my family nor I could overcome without substantial loans or the consideration of attending a community college instead.

"This scholarship allowed me to attend the university of my choice—the University of California, Riverside (UCR)—and opened doors to networking and learning opportunities I could have never imagined."

She faced and overcame some adversities during her first year, including imposter syndrome and learning how to be independent while being miles away from her parents.

"I joined several organizations on campus, including Mujeres Unidas and the Latino Student Business Association. Through these groups, I built meaningful relationships with other students, developed a strong support network, and created lasting connections."

This June, Stephanie graduated UCR with a Bachelor's in Business Administration, a concentration in Marketing, and a minor in International Relations. She plans to pursue a Master's in Business Administration this fall. Stephanie has been accepted to UCR's graduate program and offered a guaranteed teacher's assistant scholarship for her second year. She is also waiting to hear back from other schools.

"I am so thankful to the Impact Scholarship's anonymous donor and the Tahoe Donner Giving Fund for making it possible for students like me to have the higher education we need to achieve our dreams," Stephanie said.
